



HRPA Chapter of Excellence Award - 2011

Overview

The HRP Chapter of Excellence Award is presented to the Chapter with the greatest achievement in the development of the Chapter during the relevant membership year.

This award recognizes excellence in Chapter initiatives that support HRP's strategic plan. This includes the development of new, or the enhancement of existing programs and services.

Award Criteria:

A detailed submission outlining how the Chapter has met the four award criteria; please format your submission to provide specific examples under each of the three criteria and explain the outcome relative to the goal and how they are linked to the strategic plan.

1. Achievement of the goals set within Chapter's strategic and/or operational plans that are aligned with the HRP's strategic plan (points 40/100).
2. Partnership development (points 20/100);
3. Promotion of the HR profession in the community (points 20/100);
4. Development of new, or enhancement of existing, member programs and services (points 20/100);

Submission Requirements:

Applications must be submitted by the Chapter president or their designate, and must reflect information for accomplishments in the membership year specified on the application form.

Award Entitlements:

- Award presented by CEO and Board Chair at the 2011 HRP Volunteer & Leadership Awards ceremony.
- One nights paid accommodation for recipient (at HRP designated hotel) and travel to and from the event (in accordance with HRP's travel expense policy, and inclusive of any scheduled Chapter President's meeting)
- One awards event pass for a guest of the recipient
- Coverage of the cost of professional development activities for the winning Chapter's members in the following fiscal year, to a maximum of \$5,000
- Inclusion in any editorial coverage on awards
