



HRPA Outstanding CHRP Award - 2011

Overview

This award recognizes a member who has received the CHRP designation in 2010 and has made a significant contribution to their place of employment. The primary focus of the award is demonstrating results achieved through translating knowledge gained into successful practices within the organization. Additional consideration is given to participation in community volunteer activities and involvement in HRP A at the chapter or provincial level.

Award Criteria:

- Be an HRP A member who has received the CHRP designation between January 01, 2010 and December 31, 2010 (required);
- Have a minimum of three years membership in HRP A (required);

AND:

1. Show a measurable contribution to their place of employment (points 75/100)
2. Show active involvement in community/volunteer activities (points 15/100)
3. Be Involved in HRP A at the chapter or provincial level (points 10/100)

Submission Requirements:

Applications must include a current resume and the submission must address the three criteria above with specific examples supporting each criteria.

Award Entitlements:

- Award presented by CEO and Board Chair at the HRP A Volunteer & Leadership Awards ceremony.
- One night paid accommodation for recipient (at HRP A designated hotel) and travel to and from the event (in accordance with HRP A's travel expense policy)
- One awards event pass for a guest of the recipient
- Inclusion in any editorial coverage on awards
